Clair Bois

Under the direction of Alice Dunoyer and Florine Wescher (Chantier Ouvert) Assisted by Kimberley Berney

The Clair Bois Foundation is an exemplary and innovative care provider for people with multiple and severe disabilities in Geneva. Its primary mission is to provide appropriate care for children, adolescents and adults with multiple disabilities. In a welcoming environment, it offers professional assistance to people living with a high degree of dependency, in order to help them progress and fulfil their objectives. The foundation's mission is also to offer suitable jobs to people with disabilities and vocational training courses to people with learning difficulties.

Clair Bois runs two restaurants that are open to the public and to residents, which are managed separately in the same way as any other restaurant in Geneva. All the production facilities, restaurants and kitchens, are training centres for people on disability insurance schemes and employ many disabled staff.

The Clair Bois Foundation commissioned us to come up with comprehensive and inclusive new restaurant concepts for the two existing establishments and for the future restaurant in Lancy. The projects aimed to be in line with sustainable development and the Clair Bois vision, i.e. space design projects that are genuine, sustainable, ethical, respectful and committed.

Next Caravan

Under the direction of Simon Husslein (Atelier Simon Husslein) **Assisted by** Damien Greder (Atelier Hypothesis) The Next Caravan project aims to design inclusive and accessible caravan interiors. The focus of the design is to create enjoyable and ergonomic spaces that are suitable for people of all abilities, the goal being to improve the atmosphere of caravan interiors, while also enhancing their functionality and comfort.

The design process began with research and analysis, where information on the needs and preferences of various target users was gathered. This included a review of existing literature on inclusivity, accessibility, universal design and ergonomics in architecture and caravan design.

Once each student had chosen their user group, they moved into the conceptual design phase, where a range of design ideas based on the research findings were generated. These ideas were then developed into detailed sketches and 2D and 3D drawings. The project focused on atmospheric quality, the choice of materials, the integration of light and ergonomics. Additional expected considerations included human rituals, social behaviour and rules, and the parameters of physical and psychological shelters.

The students used a holistic design process that included th use of virtual reality technology. This enabled them to test and iterate their designs on a 1 to 1 scale, to experience the spatial conditions during the project and to iterate until they reached a final design that met the needs of their users. The studio resulted in a caravan interior that is both aesthetically pleasing and functional, and that improves the overall experience of caravanning for people of all abilities.

Open Climate

Under the direction of Philippe Rahm (Philippe Rahm Architectes) **Assisted by** Valentin Calame

The unlimited use of energy in the 20th century - facilitated by fossil fuels and easy access to health, generated by vaccination and antibiotics - has dissociated material and natural reasons from social and human reasons, as if the latter were only forged and developed in an ideal world with no material ties. The pandemic in 2020 and global warming, which has been fully apparent since 2022 in the frequent heatwaves in the West, as well as the energy crisis of the winter of 2022-2023, marked the end of this modern dissociation. These factors have brought illness, heat and cold back into the home, reminding us of the importance of ventilation to dissipate aerosol contamination, confirming the importance of thermal insulation to reduce CO2 emissions, and reminding us of the convergence of aesthetic and thermal choices to reduce heat in summer and cold in winter - the concordance of social and climate issues.

This new material reality of social matters was at the heart of the work carried out in our studio, which set out to redefine today's workplaces (industry and offices), to bring together physical and social comfort, and to invent dynamic meeting places, vibrant and productive atmospheres, and social and human gualities in the natural reality of temperatures, air flows and light. Physical qualities - warmth in winter, coolness in summer, natural light at all times, but without overheating in summer, noisefree, chemically healthy indoor environments - are at the root of a spatial and decorative reconfiguration, of a new form of interior architecture where heat science, acoustics, indoor air quality and light will have the power to shape new human working environments in the 21st century.

Students had the opportunity to work on a real site, a future office and production building in Juvigny (Haute-Savoie). It will contain around 2,000 m2 of offices and 3,000 m2 of factory space.

Paper coverts rock

Under the direction of Ana Luisa Soares and Ahmed Belkhodia (fala atelier) **Assisted by** Camille Bagnoud (COCI studio)

Paper Covers Rock focused on the project as something that is nestled between two realities: on the one hand, paper, i.e. speculative blueprints and drawings and their related aspects; on the other hand, rock, or the physical context and built manifestations of the project - two poles which are in constant dialogue, explored simultaneously by interior architects.

We started the semester with two short and discrete case studies. One of them focused on a relevant "paper" project, drawn from the history of architecture, that aimed to offer a form of alternative reality through drawings and other tools of representation. While these materials often relate to the larger urban scale, we speculated on interiors that strive for some sort of coherence. The other case study concerned "rock" - the very concrete situations in which we work. The projects took place within urban villas that are typical of the city of Lausanne and the surrounding region. These buildings form a radically discontinuous urbanity, one made of isolated interiors and that might seem at odds with the totalising horizons depicted by the "paper" studies. We also went on a field trip to visit some of these buildings and get familiar with their context.

In a second phase, the aim was to translate some of the ideas gathered from "paper" to "rock" and vice-versa, to see how the "rock" might influence the "paper" ideas. We offered interior transformations within the urban villas, each of them attempting to reflect on the tension between the existing and the possible, between the somewhat bourgeois banality of the urban villas and the bold utopia of "paper architecture".



MA Space and Communication is a Design Installation graduate programme that explores the medium of installation as a design practice.


The programme encourages the development of experimental design practices inhabiting the intersections of research, space, media, performance and objects.
