We invite applications for the full-time position of Doctoral Researcher for the period of September 2023 to August 2026 for the research project entitled *The Future of Humanitarian Design,* funded by the Swiss National Science Foundation (SNFS Sinergia).

The Future of Humanitarian Design (HUD) is a research project based upon the principle that the dilemmas facing humanitarian action can only be addressed through a transvocational ethos integrating the insights of humanitarian actors, technologists, designers, and social scientists. Its underlying mission – and first core goal – is to develop what it terms a future-oriented ecological approach to the co-design of technological, material, and aesthetic interventions. That approach is specifically premised on combining the methodological and conceptual tools developed by designers and technologists with the sophisticated models of complex 'ecological' social relations that have been developed across numerous social sciences (international relations, sociology, anthropology) but which have yet to be applied to problems like humanitarian crisis. Those approaches contain a deep understanding of the ways in which human practice and sociality is driven by complex relational interactions between different actors, including material, technological, and aesthetic objects. In HUD's view, these ecological theories of social life can fruitfully inject a deeper understanding of sociality and politics into ongoing debates on the role of design and technology in humanitarian action.

The PhD will be supervised by the Department of International Relations/Political Science (Chair Prof. Anna Leander) of the Geneva Graduate Institute (degree-awarding university) together with the Department of Interior Architecture / Space Design (Associate Prof. Javier Fernández Contreras) at HEAD – Genève and the University of Copenhagen (Assistant Prof. Jonathan Luke Austin). The Doctoral Researcher will be part of an international research community for the SNFS-funded project that includes a series of professors, postdocs researchers and PhD candidates also located at the Geneva Graduate Institute, the HEAD –Genève, the University of Copenhagen and the EPFL in Lausanne.

Main points of the position of Doctoral Researcher

• Over the course of the four years, the Doctoral Researcher will be trained to participate in international conferences and exhibitions crossing the humanitarian, academic and artistic environments, to submit articles to peer- reviewed journals, participate in research-related pedagogic activities and contribute to experimental public platforms.
